This process will begin again in two years and hopefully it will be more defined, clear and understood by all schools. I appreciate the hard work by the CIFSS office staff to develop a consistent and fair plan for playoff grouping. And believe it or not, I appreciate the concerns of those who appealed and their angst over having to play larger schools in the playoffs or where one dominate school may carry that league to a high playoff grouping. The CIFSS Council, by a close vote, decided to change the rules for determining playoff groupings. This was a classic example of how the CIFSS operates and how the democratic process works....once again, CIFSS is **YOU**, the Principals and Athletic Directors.

I am a principal at school with 2,000 students and it was very enlightening to hear about the trials and tribulations of much smaller schools who want to compete while facing the daunting task of long trips and trying to find enough students to field teams. Thank you again for all your hard work and for making a difference in the lives of your student athletes.

## CIF-SS COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES January 19, 2006

The January meeting of the CIF Southern Section Council was called to order by President John Dahlem at 9:04 at The Grand in Long Beach, California. All leagues were present with the exception of Agape, Del Rey, Express, Foothill, Harbor, Mulholland, Omega, San Joaquin, Valley and Westside.

**1. ADOPT AGENDA** - It was moved, seconded and passed to adopt the agenda.

**2. MINUTES** - It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the minutes of the CIF Council meeting of October 13, 2005. Additionally, minutes of the CIF-SS Executive Committee meeting of November 9, 2005 were submitted as an informational item.

**3. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL** - Earl Haugen, President-Elect, presented the following agenda items for the State Federated Council in order to give delegates voting direction:

A. Revision of CIF By-Law 22.B.12: Conditions of membership - vote to support.

B. Revision of CIF By-Law 524: Steroid prohibition - vote to support.

**4. SOUTHWESTERN LEAGUE PROPOSAL** - Stan Ford, Athletic Director, Temecula Valley High School reviewed a proposal which would change playoff groupings from a four year cycle to a two year cycle. Following discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to approve the proposal.

**5. CIF-SS SWIMMING ADVISORY COMMITTEE PROPOSAL** - Rob Wigod, CIF-SS Assistant Commissioner, reviewed a proposal which would establish a Masters Meet competition in swimming and diving. Following discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to approve the proposal.

**6. ORANGE LEAGUE PROPOSAL** - Terry Orabona, Athletic Director, Santa Ana Valley High School, presented a proposal which would move the first allowable contest and last allowable contest in girls golf up by one week to accommodate adding two Individual Regional tournaments to girls golf post season schedule. Following discussion it was moved, seconded and passed to approve the proposal.

**7. CIF STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL NON-ACTION ITEMS** - Earl Haugen, President-Elect, presented the following non-action item which will be an action item on the February Federated Council Agenda:

A. Continuation of CIF Boys & Girls State Golf Championships.

## MARKETING UPDATE

### NEW CIF-SS REGULAR SEASON TELEVISION POLICY; LINKING EVERYONE TOGETHER

*TV contracts for over-the-air and regional cable broadcasts must go through Southern Section office.*

The new TV contract policy overwhelmingly approved at the October, 2005 CIF-SS Council meeting went into effect last November. This new program creates a 'collegiate conference' type structure where all the TV broadcasts for regular season and playoff games on major TV outlets (FSN, KCAL 9, KVMD, ESPNU, etc.) are now contracted by CIF-SS staff.

This is a growing trend and a recent conversation with the V.P. from Fox Sports Net indicates that a number of other large states have also gone to this structure. Why?

There are many reasons, all of which are positive, as we move through this transition period where some schools and television carriers are adjusting to this new procedure:

- a) No expenses to host school: Extra costs for power or over time security staff, or even bringing in extra lights, will be at the expense of the TV production companies expense.
- b) Advance coordination: Each game contracted will include a required pre-production meeting at the school at least five days prior to the game. No more surprises!
- c) Title IX issues: We must begin to address Title IX and this includes some TV coverage. Some smaller TV outlets may not have the income to pay rights fees but will trade out coverage of girls games so that we can expand exposure and opportunities.
- d) TV rights are worth something: Only two regular season football games in six years have received any rights fees. The regular season rights fee that is generated will be split between the participating schools on those occasions a rights fee is paid. Our schools will benefit and, by working in a coordinated fashion everyone will benefit so that we are not inadvertently giving away games and working against one another.

It is important that your staff and coaches understand the process.

- 1) Local cable season broadcasts, during the regular season, such as those on Cox Channel 3 or your school/school district channel are not affected. You can do them without CIF-SS contract involvement during the regular season. Playoff policy remains the same and requires CIF-SS involvement.
- 2) For TV or regional cable broadcasts, you can determine if this rule applies by asking if someone can see the game with an antenna, satellite dish or will the cable operator show the game regionally (jump a city and show it further away). When any of these occur, you must refer the broadcast rights to the CIF-SS.
- 3) This policy includes games played within the Southern Section; even if the game is being organized by an outside promoter or in a tournament format.
- 4) You can say no to a regular season broadcast. However, if you do decline a broadcast it cannot later be telecast by someone else.

This new policy is meant to enhance the television experience and exposure of all member schools. Most recently, FSN telecast a boys volleyball match with great ratings and both schools split the rights fee too!

We are currently negotiating with Fox Sports Net for a greatly enhanced TV package beginning this fall and then hope to expand further broadcasts with other over-the-air TV stations.

Ultimately this transition to collectively packaging our TV rights is expected to succeed in a similar fashion as the college conferences have found the past decade.

## COMMISSIONER'S CORNER

### The Democratic Process

Last month I witnessed a process that I hope to never see again. I was part of a group of high school sports administrators who went to Sacramento to voice our objections to two bills, SB 1411 and AB 2312. We were there to listen to the Assembly and Senate hearings process. Both Bills were written to give immediate eligibility to students who transfer from one school to another. Both were defeated. I don't think the fight is over and I am very concerned about the future. My concern stems not so much from the intent of these two Bills, but from the process: actually from the lack of process.

First a little background. SB 1411 was introduced by Senator Ortiz, from Sacramento. She was contacted by a former colleague and asked to carry a bill allowing for a one-time transfer; a "free pass" if you will. AB 2312 was introduced by Assemblywoman Strickland from the Westlake, Oxnard area. Her bill was even less restrictive than SB 1411. It would have allowed for unlimited transfers. The genesis of this bill is unknown. We have no idea about what caused this legislator to take up this particular cause. No one working in any CIF office was contacted prior to the introduction of either of these bills, hence my concern.

How did this happen? Would we expect that a legislator, not particularly schooled in CIF, do some investigating prior to writing a law? Is this how laws are enacted? Shouldn't a need to write a law be established before it is written?

CIF is proud of its nearly 100 year tradition of governing high school sports. A person could read through the progression of our rules and see how times forced change, but never bent to whim or fancy. Minutes of meetings that went on 75 years ago reveal the passion that school administrators had at the time for the safety and welfare of students. New sports were introduced; some discontinued. High School sports survived wars, lean economic times and

# MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

## January 28, 2006

The January meeting of the CIF Southern Section Executive Committee was called to order at 8:30 a.m. by President John Dahlem in the Sago Palm Suite of the Riviera Resort and Racquet Club, Palm Springs, California. All members were present with the exception of Edna Herring, Jim Monico and Susan Rainey.

### 1. OPENING BUSINESS

E. Adopt Agenda – It was moved, seconded and passed to adopt the agenda.

F. Approval of Minutes – Minutes of the November 9, 2005 Executive Committee Meeting – It was moved, seconded and approved.

### 4. NON-ACTION SESSION

A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL NON-ACTION ITEMS - No items were presented as non-action for the State Federated Meeting, however, items to be discussed will be:

1. State budget
2. Nominations for Federated Council President-Elect and Executive Committee Members.

### B. SOUTHERN SECTION NON-ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposal from Southwestern League on Summer Rules – After discussion, it was decided to clarify this proposal and bring it back as a non-action item for the next Council meeting. It was suggested to look at the whole dead period idea and adjust it rather than support this proposal. The current calendar is based on a traditional school year and many districts are going to non-traditional school years. Stan Ford will meet with the office staff to discuss the dead period issue further.

### 5. OLD BUSINESS

A. Proposal from Bay League on Water Polo Rule 3008, Maximum Team Contests – This item was withdrawn from the agenda.

B. Membership Dues – Delinquent Schools – Animo Leadership has paid their dues prior to the meeting. It was moved, seconded and approved to revoke the membership of Community Harvest Charter and New Covenant Academy if their dues are not paid by February 3, 2006.

### 6. NEW BUSINESS

A. Consideration of membership status for the 2006-2007 school year –

1. Calvary Baptist Christian School – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and approved to grant full membership for the 2006-2007 school year

2. Firebaugh High School – After discussion, it was decided to postpone this application until the school status has been clarified. This application will be presented at the April 12, 2006 Executive Committee meeting.

3. Xavier College Preparatory High School – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and approved to grant probationary membership for the 2006-2007 school year and to review their status at the May 23, 2007 Executive Committee meeting for full membership.

B. Discussion of CIF Southern Section Membership Application – This item was approved as an administrative item. Item (b) on page three of the membership application now reads:

“Schools must plan to field one or more athletic teams *in each season of sport.* (Fall, Winter and Spring)”

C. CIF Southern Section Calendar of Meeting Dates for 2006-2007 – This item was distributed as an informational item. The August meeting date was changed to August 13-15, 2006.

D. Proposal(s) for Modification of Rule 214 Transfer Eligibility – The CIF state office proposed a uniform rule and is working with all sections to modify the present rule. A thirty day period of restriction is being discussed.

E. CIF Southern Section Mission Statement – The Executive Committee members broke into two groups to discuss a new mission statement. All ideas will be considered and formulated into a new mission statement for the Southern Section.

### 7. CLOSED SESSION

The closed session began at 11:19 a.m. and the meeting resumed at 11:26 a.m.

### 8. REPORT SESSION

A. Presidents Reports – President John Dahlem – Requested all members to contact their area representatives on a regular basis to keep the constituents aware of who they are and to make themselves available as much as possible. The Nominating Committee met and will recommend names on c e Jim has contacted them for positions of area representative, at-large and president-elect. He also discussed the meeting with Bloomington High School representatives regarding a football game which produced a highly uneven score. The school will send a remediation program to the office to avoid this situation occurring again in the future. The school was not censored and did not lose any funds. The Football Advisory Committee was advised about the results of the meeting.

President-Elect Earl Haugen – Wished everyone good luck for the rest of the year.

Past-President Paul Breit – Commended the committee on their congeniality and ability to work together.

B. Treasurer's Report – Susie Arce read the report and gave an overview of the revenue from the sports played this year to date.

C. Commissioner's Report – Jim Staunton stated the following:

- The Southern Section office will email a list of all Council Area Representatives to Executive Committee members to allow them to communicate with each other on a regular basis.

- At the Commissioners' Meeting, they did a mock up football selection. It was a good process.

- He thanked the members for their work on the Mission Statement.

- He reported on the Pursuing Victory with Honor One-Day Coaches' Training held at Laguna Beach this past week and stated they may be two more school-held trainings in the future at Mater Dei or Servite and Temecula and we have also heard from View Point Preparatory.

### D. Executive Committee Member Reports

1. Activities Director Representative Terry Speir – At her last league meeting, the superintendent attended. She promoted Pursuing Victory with Honor trainings and he was very supportive of this training. Her students will be taking their trip to Lee Vining soon. They plan to ski and play in the snow.

2. Small Schools Area Representative Tom Peters – He had 80 schools that owed their dues. They contacted all of them and was thankful for the help he received.

3. Assistant Commissioner Rob Wigod – Thanks all committee members for their help and support at the football finals. Girls wrestling was held last week and was well run. He was very pleased to see the support of the State office.

4. State CIF Executive Committee Member Dr. Gary Smidderks – There are some changes taking place at CAPSO. The president has had to resign and several other officials have changed. CAPSO is working with State CIF regarding rules.

5. Girls' Athletic Director Representative Janet Berardi – On February 27, 2006 at her Athletic Directors' meeting, principals of Orange County will be honored.

The governor of Montana, who is a former Olympic ice skater, will be speaking. She will also be speaking on February 28<sup>th</sup> honoring women in sports.

6. Citrus Belt Area Representative Rhonda Fouch – At an area representative meeting, the basketball officials assignor told them they may want to separate their area into two areas. The athletic directors plan to discuss this idea. The assignors are meeting with Paul Castillo on February 2, 2006. She also received a call regarding the request for league standings and possible interference with Sunday, a day of respite.

7. Northern Area Representative Bill Dabbs – Wrestling has gone very well with the new testing. Their school nurse has gone to Granada Hills to do assessments. Also he was at a girls wrestling tournament and twelve girls qualified for the state championship. He enjoyed presenting at the St. Bonaventure and Moorpark football game.

8. Parochial Area Representative Sr. Cheryl Milner – She received an invitation from the school that received the Champions for Character award to attend their ceremony. They have put a letter together about the award and how they felt about it.

9. Mt. SAC Area Representative Guy Roubian – There was some talk about a new school in the Chaffey District, however, their plans have been slowed because of enrollment.

10. School Board Member Representative Sue Kuwabara – OCSBA had a dinner meeting at which Bill Beecham talked about steroids. It was very interesting and an eye opener. She also thanked Jim Staunton and Roger Blake for coming to her conference.

11. Coast Area Representative Dan Stepenosky – He has heard a lot of talk about steroids and he also enjoyed presenting a plaque at a football final.

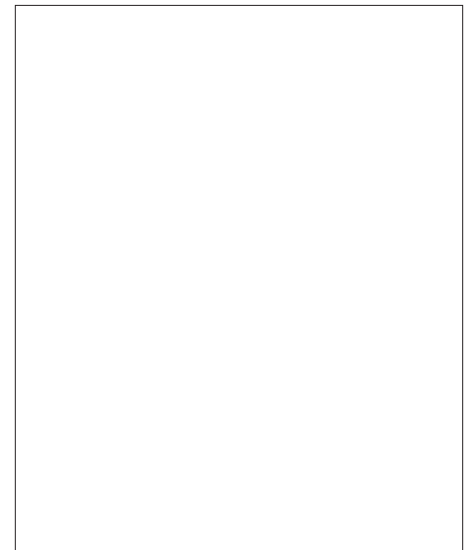
There being no further business to come before the Executive Committee, the meeting was adjourned at 12:05 p.m.

## RULE REVIEW



### Rule Changes for 2006-07

There are a few changes and things to be aware of as we slowly fade out of 2005-06 and get prepared for 2006-07.

Many of these changes are the result of council vote, Executive Committee meetings and office policy. All need to be highlighted so that you can rest this summer in the knowledge that you are ready for another new sports year.

1. It's very important to use written contracts for scheduling contests. Review By-Law 150 in the Bluebook.

2. When hiring coaches make sure you review the Association Rule (By-Law 312) with all potential applicants prior to hiring.

3. Check the CIF-SS website frequently for announcements, in-service dates, rule updates and other information.

4. Check current National Federation rule books for equipment or uniform rule changes for 2006-07.

5. Review summertime rules with your coaching staff. Specific language is located under each particular sports section in the Bluebook.

6. The normal Summer Dead Period will be July 31 to August 20, 2006. New this summer is the ability to declare a different summer dead period for each of your other sports, as well. You should have already returned the Declaration of 2006 Summer Dead Period to the CIF-SS Office.

7. Make sure all sport schedules are submitted to your Area Liaison and sport unit assignors by the specific due dates. This is extremely important in helping your school to be adequately covered by officials for each sport.

8. Fall Packets will be available for pick-up at the CF-SS Office on August 14, 2006.

9. Make sure to read your new Bluebook (when you pick it up) with all new rule language. Pay specific attention to new rules and wording regarding mileage and athletic contracts.

These are just some of the items to keep in mind as we head into the summer. Should you need a more detailed explanation of these or any other areas of interest it is important that you contact the office for clarification from one of the administrators.

Have a great summer and we look forward to serving you in the coming year.

## CIF-SS TEAMS CLAIM STATE BASKETBALL TITLES

Seven CIF Southern Section teams entered the 2006 State CIF Basketball championship and four of those schools came away with titles. Three girls' teams and one boy's team claimed championships at Arco Arena. For the ladies at Troy and Bishop Amat it marked a second-consecutive championship trophy.

After this year's 5-5 split, the South has won 78 of the 120 games (65 percent) since the state championships were revived in 1981.

Following is a closer look at each state championship final game:

#### Division IV Girls:

Sophomore Jasmine Jackson scored six of her 12 points in overtime as Sacred Heart Cathedral defeated Windward, 66-56 in OT, to win the girls' Division IV state title.

Freshman Tierra Rogers led the Irish (32-2) with 13 points, Ki-Shawna Moore had 12 and Fahiza Hill added 11 — but they won the game with their tenacious defense, forcing Windward into 33 turnovers. The Wildcats (29-4) got 24 points from Hailey Dunham, and 11 from Monica De Angelis, but were outshot 65-44 from the field and 39-18 from the free-throw line.

It had looked as if Sacred Heart Cathedral would run away with the game in the third quarter, as the Irish forced turnovers on six straight possessions and took a 35-27 lead. On the next Wildcat possession, another turnover seemed imminent as the shot clock ran down with De Angelis 33 feet from the basket. But De Angelis' desperation three was good and sparked a 16-1 Windward run, during which Dunham scored 11 straight points, including three straight old-school three-point plays.

The Warriors extended the lead to eight, 47-39, with 4:17 remaining, but the Irish defense kept creating turnovers and Rogers converted a steal into a basket that tied the game at 50 with 1:25 left. Regulation ended with the score 52-52, and Moore's slightly rushed layup at the buzzer could have won it — but it was too hard off the glass, and the game went to overtime.

But Dunham had fouled out with 1:44 left in regulation, and when Erica Latimer followed her to the bench with 3:23 left in overtime, Windward simply couldn't generate enough offense to keep up with the Irish. Though Sacred Heart made just one basket in the extra period, the Irish were 12 of 15 from the free-throw line.

The state title was the second for the Irish, who won a Division III championship in 1998, and were runners-up in 2001 and 2003. The win gave Northern California a 14-5 edge in Division IV title games.

#### Division II Girls:

Twins Rhaya and Rheyne Neabors each scored 14 points as Troy won its third girls' Division II state title in the past four years by downing Carondelet, 51-46. The Warriors (33-1), ranked sixth in the nation by USA Today, won their second straight championship and have lost only two games in the past two seasons, both to defending national champion Christ the King of New York in the Nike TOC in Phoenix.

Jayne Appel led Carondelet (29-4) with 24 points, nine rebounds and four blocked shots. Mary Canders added 10 for the Cougars, who led 18-9 with 5:10 remaining in the first half before a 21-4 Troy run spanning the second and third quarters put the Warriors up by eight.

Appel led a comeback that tied the game at 36, but the constant pressure wore down Carondelet in the fourth quarter. The Neabors sisters, had 11 of the Warriors' 13 points in the final period.

Troy's victory avenged a defeat to Carondelet in the 2004 state championship game, which the Cougars won 48-41. The win also gives Southern California a 13-12 edge in the D-II title series.

#### Division II Boys:

Jeremy Lin scored 17 points as underdog Palo Alto shocked nationally ranked Mater Dei, 51-47, to win the boys' Division II state championship.

The Vikings (32-1) won their second state title while handing the Monarchs (33-3), ranked 19th by Studentsports.com, their second straight upset defeat in the state title game. Last year, unheralded Oak Ridge knocked off heavily favored Mater Dei 60-44. The Monarchs got 23 points from 6-7 Travis King, but didn't use the height of 7-1 Alex Jacobson or 6-7 Steve Tarin to their best advantage, settling for 22 three-point attempts out of their 58 shots. Kameron Brown was the only other Mater Dei player in double figures, with 10.

Down two with slightly more than two minutes remaining, the Monarchs harassed the Vikings into a near shot-clock violation, but Lin banked in a 27-foot three-pointer as the buzzer sounded to put Palo Alto up by five again — and the Monarchs could never get closer than two down the stretch.

Southern Cal has dominated the Division II boys' competition, winning 18 of the 25 title games.

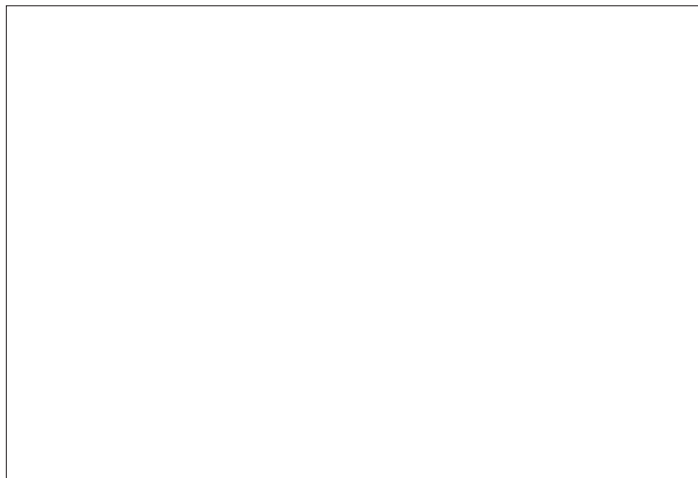

James Harden scored 21 points as Artesia rolled over St. Mary's of Stockton, 60-41, to win the Division III boys state championship.

Malik Story added 12 and Derek Glasser 11 for the Pioneers (33-1), who lost only to Hughes Center of Ohio this year — and that was by just one point.

Joe Harden led the Rams (31-4) with 17 points, but St. Mary's was hurt by the loss of 6-6 starting center Mark Payne, who injured his ankle in practice and was unable to play. The Pioneers, ranked sixth in the nation by Studentsports.com, jumped out to an early 7-0 lead and were never seriously tested the rest of the way. They controlled the boards, outrebounding the Rams, 40-32, forced 19 turnovers and held St. Mary's to just 31 percent shooting.

It was the fourth state title for Artesia, but the first since 1993, when the Pioneers were a Division II school. The Pioneers were runners-up in Division III in 1995. The win evened the North-South matchup in Division III boys at 12-12.

Nine other players scored for the deep Jackrabbits (11-25), who outrebounded the Yellowjackets (21-12) 43-34, and forced 21 turnovers.

Alexandria Mitchell's eight points topped Berkeley, which was held to its lowest point total of the season.

Berkeley led the game twice, 2-0 and 5-4, but the margin steadily widened throughout the course of the game. Poly's press wasn't as deadly as it can be, but the

Jackrabbit half court defense forced Berkeley into just 33 percent shooting and held the Yellowjackets scoreless for the first 4:57 of the third quarter. During that span, Poly extended a 24-18 halftime lead to what turned out to be an insurmountable 34-18 advantage.

Berkeley also had its problems this season, as the Jackets were 4-7 at one point. They came back, however, to win two games on the road during NorCals and set a record for margin of victory with a 66-28 win over Napa in the NorCal championship game. This marked Berkeley's sixth trip to the state finals. The Yellowjackets won the championship in 1991 and 1997 and were runners-up in 1998, 2000, 2001 and now 2006. The Jackrabbits' win gives Southern California schools a 17-8 edge in Division I girls' title games.

## NORTHVIEW FINISHES FIFTH AT STATE WRESTLING

Claiming their first title in school history, Buchanan High School of Clovis (CS) racked-up 134.0 points. Poway of the San Diego Section took second with 126.5. Northview finished fifth in this years tournament as the highest ranking team from the Southern Section. It was the Vikings first Top-5 finish in the state tournament. The Southern Section had two individual champions. Shad Manigault from Northview claimed the title in the 140-pound category and Sione Fua from Crespi at 275 pounds. Southern

Section schools also had 28 other wrestlers place in the Top-8 at 13 different weights. This was the second year the tournament was held at Bakersfield's Rabobank Arena after being held at The Spanos Center on the campus of the University of the Pacific since 1988 (15 years).

legal challenges. Always we have been able to govern ourselves in a manner consistent with our philosophy.

Now we face a new challenge. Parents, dissatisfied with our decisions, are approaching legislators in an effort to gain their way. Many have credible stories; on the surface. A listener may wonder why CIF rules are punitive and seek to make an immediate change. After all, it's just high school sports isn't it? Why can't kids play wherever they want? Rather than spend our time fighting laws and answering questions, we need to spend time educating.

CIF must make an effort to work with legislators and tell them the wonderful services we provide to all of our athletes: Pursuing Victory with Honor, Coaches' training, self-expression, school pride, positive alternatives to violence and drugs

and the opportunity to play in venues reserved for only the best professionals, regulation of eligibility so athletes can play fairly against comparable opponents. We have a long and proud history, share it. We can't wait until a bill is introduced to talk to our representatives. Make an appointment to say hello, introduce yourself and talk about your school. Write a letter or send an email to your local legislator. Let people know that rules were developed over time, in a rational manner with the consent of the governed. Talk about our processes, Southern Section Council and the Executive Committee's leadership role. Communicate our goals. Be open about our failures. Become part of the democratic process. It does not serve CIF to be thought of as a secretive organization whose processes are not known to everyone. Help us work with Sacramento. Let everyone know about what we do and why.
