CIF-SS COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

January 25, 2017

1. OPENING BUSINESS

A. Call to order by Carter Paysinger, President of the Council at 9:12 am

B. Pledge of Allegiance

Executive Committee members were asked to stand and be recognized. Ron Nocetti – CIF Associate Executive Director. Steve Fryer – Orange County Register.

E. Adopt Agenda

Motion and a second to adopt agenda as written. Motion Passed: 59-0-20

F. Approval of Minutes

1. Minutes of the October 4, 2016 Council Meeting Motion and a second to accept the minutes of the October 4, 2016 Council Meeting. Motion Passed: 74-0-2

2. PUBLIC HEARING SESSION

A. Recognition of anyone wishing to address the Council. Speakers must limit their remarks to three minutes. There were no speakers present.

3. ACTION ITEMS

A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposal to Revise Bylaw 1501, Baseball Pitch Count Motion and a second to approve revised STATE 539 - President-Elect Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal. There is a mandate from the NFHS Baseball Rules Committee that each state implement a Baseball Pitch Count related to the health and safety of participants. This rule addresses the number pitches thrown and days of rest required between appearances. Motion Passed: 69-7-3

B. SOUTHERN SECTION ACTION ITEMS

There are no Southern Section Action Items at this time.

4. NON-ACTION ITEMS

A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL NON-ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposed CIF Budget for 2017-2018 No CIF Budget to review at this time. A proposed CIF Budget for 2017-2018 will be presented to the CIF Federated Council for review and discussion at their meeting on January 27, 2017.

2. CIF Executive Committee Nominations. The CIF Nominating Committee, as per CIF Bylaw 70.E, met by conference call and nominated candidates (see Southern Section Council packet) for a one-year term, 2017-2018, to serve on the CIF Executive Commit-

tee. Additional nominations will also be accepted from the floor. The Southern

Section representatives will ask the Southern Section Council to send them uninstructed with the provision that they will vote for those nominees who are Southern Section candidates.

3. Proposed Bylaws 504; 1200; 1700; 1701; 1702 - Competitive Cheer - The proposed bylaw would add Competitive Cheer to the CIF Constitution and Bylaws. Further, these bylaws would require that all individuals who coach competitive cheer must fulfill nationally recognized safety training standards as mandated by A.B 949. Commissioner Wigod addressed the members with an update from the first Cheer Advisory meeting held on January 23, 2017. At this meeting, he stated that the immediate goal of the Cheer Advisory Committee is to help develop bylaws for Cheer. Once the bylaws have been approved, they will be implemented during the 2017-2018 school year.

4. Proposed Revision Bylaws 1606; 2401; 2901; 2902 -Competitive Equity Placement - The proposed bylaw would

revise the placement of teams into CIF Southern Regional and CIF State Championships in the sports of Boys/Girls Basketball, Boys/Girls Soccer and Boys/Girls Volleyball to be based upon a Competitive Equity model. The Southern Section currently has this model in place.

5. Proposed Bylaws Revisions 503.B.1 - Uniform Administrative Penalty - This proposed bylaw revision would create a uniform penalty to address the situation for when a student is eligible, but the school fails to submit the required transfer eligibility paperwork. Currently, each CIF Section has its own bylaw in place on how to penalize the school/team for the omission by the school official. The Southern Section has had a similar bylaw in place for many years that has addressed this situation adequately.

6. Proposed Revision Bylaws 206; 207; 510; 1100 - Athletically Motivated Transfers - The proposed bylaw revisions would eliminate specific wording in CIF Bylaw 510 regarding verbal and written disagreements with the prior school's athletic department in regard to Athletically Motivated Transfers. There was no discussion of this proposal at

this time.

7. Proposed Bylaws 1206 – Standardized Number of Contests - The proposed new bylaw would create a standardized number of maximum contests in sports that culminate in a CIF Southern Regional or CIF State Championship. The concept is to bring all sections into alignment in relation to the number of contests (contacts) allowed. There was no discussion of this proposal at this time.

8. Proposed Bylaws 900 – All-Star Contests - The proposed bylaw revision would modify the wording of the current bylaw further clarifying factors determining what an “all-star” competition is and who may participate. Current practice is that “all-star” competition is for graduating seniors only who have started their seventh semester of eligibility. This proposal would allow all students at any grade level to participate in an “all-star” competition after the conclusion of the last Section or State contest in that sport for that particular year.

B. SOUTHERN SECTION NON-ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposed CIF Southern Section Budget 2017-18 - Mitch Carty, Southern Section CFO, presented a first read of the 2017-2018 Southern Section Budget and highlighted the major categories for review. He noted that there are no changes in playoff ticket prices and school Sport Fees. He did note that the Southern Section had a decrease of over 40,000 football playoff tickets sold in comparison to the 2015-2016 school year. Mr. Carty highlighted that the investment fund category has shown success and a positive increase. Some decreases in the proposed budget were noted: Office Salaries, Technology, Area Liaisons and Basketball Championships.

2. CIF Southern Section Executive Committee Nominations - Representatives from the Coast Area, Mt. SAC Area and the Orange County area will be elected at the Southern Section Council meeting on April 5, 2017. Only leagues from those three areas will take part in voting for their respective area representatives.

3. Proposed Bylaw 3013 – Length of Quarters - Motion specific to the sport of water polo. The proposal calls for a standardized length of quarters for all non-varsity contests in both boys and girls water polo. Discussion: Question asked “Could two schools mutually agree to shorten the length of quarters

at the lower levels”? Answer was “Yes they could.”

4. Proposed Bylaws 1505, 1508, 2506, 2509, 2703, 2705 - 2906, 2908 – 2018-2019 Sports Calendar - The proposed sports calendar for the 2018-2019 school year is an effort to reflect the start and end dates of our member school’s academic calendars. In addition to adjusting the calendar for the sports that offer CIF Regional Championships and CIF State Championships, this proposal would adjust the start and end dates for the following sports that do not offer a CIF Regional or CIF State Championship. They are: Girls Tennis, Baseball, Softball and Boys Volleyball. Discussion did take place regarding the SOP (Sit- Out Period) Bylaw. Commissioner Wigod stated that there is no exact language at this time, but did announce that the SOP will be changed to align with the changes in the seasons of sport.

5. REPORTS

A. Financial Report - Mitch Carty - CFO Carty spoke to this topic in 4.B.1 above.

B. Treasurer’s Report - Jeff Jordan - Jeff Jordan indicated that the budget is \$124,443 less than projected due to a decrease in football tickets sold this past Fall. With that decrease, playoff revenue returned to the schools to date was still at \$528,425. Mr. Jordan also noted that other sport revenues are on target as well as expense projections and investment returns.

C. President’s Report - Carter Paysinger - Carter Paysinger updated the membership on progress made toward the implementation of having full-time athletic trainers at each school. More discussion is taking place and school district offices and board members are responding. Secondly, Carter praised the Southern Section Office Staff for their continued excellent performance during the playoff season. Also, he noted that a friend commented on how the NCAA is vilified by some in the public arena who do not realize that individual colleges and universities are the ones who decide what the rules are and how they should be applied. In much the same way, high schools are responsible for CIF rules and their application. Parents, fans and others need to realize that the CIF and its Sections only follow the rules given them by our member schools.

D. Commissioner’s Report - Rob Wigod - Mr. Wigod thanked members for simply being here and participating. Mr. Carty was praised and thanked for

his fine work in dealing with our budget. Regarding football ticket sales and receipts, Mr. Wigod was particularly thoughtful about the need for all to see that everyone needs to make sure that ticket sales are being accounted for. Without proper controls, schools could see a decrease in revenue shares back to member schools or possibly an increase in Sport Fees. He did note that there were few questions this morning about some very significant proposals. If members have questions, they should be calling our office for discussion and answers. Also, don’t forget that the Champions for Character Golf Tournament is coming and the proceeds fund awards and scholarships for student-athletes. Finally, the office needs nominations for the Hall of Fame and Distinguished Service Awards.

MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

January 14, 2017

1. OPENING BUSINESS

A. Call to order by Carter Paysinger, President of the Council

The meeting was called to order at 9:42 a.m.

B. Pledge of Allegiance

After the Pledge of Allegiance, Carter Paysinger wished every one a Happy New Year.

C. Roll Call

All members were present, except John Costello, Jeff Jordan, Jill Matyuch, and Kristine Palle.

D. Introduction of Guests

There were no guests present.

E. Adopt Agenda

There was a motion and a second to adopt the agenda. The agenda was adopted.

F. Approval of Minutes

There was a motion and a second to approve the minutes of the September 29, 2016 Executive Committee meeting. The minutes were approved.

2. PUBLIC COMMENT

A. Recognition of anyone wishing to address the Executive Committee. Speakers must limit their remarks to three minutes. There was no one present to address the Executive Committee.

3. ACTION ITEMS

A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposal to Revise Bylaw 1501, Baseball Pitch Count - Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal regarding the baseball pitch count. The NFHS has mandated that every state association adopt a pitch count bylaw for this Spring, including mandated days of rest between appearances. The Executive Committee is making a recommendation to the Southern Section Council whether to adopt or not adopt the proposal as written. There was a motion and second to approve the proposal. Mike West had questions regarding the number of days of rest, whether it should be three or four between appearances, as proposed. Chris Calderwood asked if the Baseball Advisory Committee approved the proposal. Glenn Martinez stated that the Baseball Advisory Committee would be meeting at the end of month, but that there seemed to be no opposition to the proposal as it is written. Terry Barnum asked if language should be added at either the CIF State or Section levels to strongly suggest public view of the pitch counts to avoid disagreements. This could be as easy as a flip count board or chalkboard. Rob Wigod stated that there are enough people out there that are already keeping track of pitch counts. Glenn Martinez agreed stating coaches are already charting pitches and smaller schools, as an example, bring out wrestling numbers to keep track, while other schools have scoreboards that do the tracking. Glenn Martinez also stated that he would mention this to the Baseball Advisory Committee when they meet. The motion carried 21-0-0

B. SOUTHERN SECTION ACTION ITEMS

There are no Southern Section Action Items at this time

4. NON-ACTION ITEMS

A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL NON-ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposed Budget for 2017-2018 - Monica Colunga stated that there were no copies of the CIF State Budget available at this time. Carter Paysinger stated that the CIF State Budget would be presented at the CIF Federated Council meeting on January 27. Rob Wigod said that we will see it then and it will be included in the April Executive Committee and Southern Section Council packets prior to those meetings.

2. CIF Executive Committee Nominations - Monica Colunga reviewed the nominations for the CIF Executive Committee. There are ten nominees, two of which are from the Southern Section. Normally, it is recommended to the Southern Section Council that they support Southern Section nominees and go uninstructed on the nominees from other sections. Terry Barnum is a candidate on the ballot from the Southern Section, representing CAPSO, an allied organization, and Jim Perry is currently serving as President-Elect of the CIF Federated Council.

3. Proposed Bylaws 504; 1200; 1700; 1701; 1702 - Competitive Cheer - Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal. There are two formats presented: Traditional Cheer and Competitive Sport Cheer. On the Southern Section and CIF State websites, there is an excellent PowerPoint presentation regarding Cheer that is very informative. The first Southern Section Cheer Advisory Committee meeting is scheduled for January 23, to talk about the proposed bylaws and implementation for the 2017-18 school year. Dick Billingsley mentioned that his school district is under a Title IX investigation and that this would be a big help in that area as his school has 88 cheerleaders. Loren Kleinrock stated that they currently have one male on their squad and does cheerleading address Title IX. Monica Colunga stated that Traditional Cheer and Competitive Sport Cheer will be different in relation to Title IX. Competitive Sport Cheer is two schools competing against each other in a four quarter event and it is a coed sport. Rob Wigod referred the Executive Committee to the key page in the proposal, which is in the 1700 Series, and are the actual bylaws. In the proposal, it clearly states that Competitive Sport Cheer will not be counted toward Title IX. Chris Calderwood asked if there has been a season of sport established for Traditional Cheer and Monica Colunga replied not yet. Rob Wigod continued that the proposal includes Competitive Sport Cheer as a Spring sport, but Traditional Cheer was very challenging as it does not fit into the Fall, Winter, or Spring seasons. Mike West suggested trying to keep things the same and Spring would be better to get into the gym for practice as there are so many sports in the Winter already using the gym. Carter Paysinger reminded the Executive Committee

that the first step going forward is to look at the proposed bylaws. There are actually three types of cheer: Sideline, Traditional, and then Competitive Sport Cheer. How does the high school cheer impact the outside cheer groups? If students are unable to compete outside of school during the season sport, that could put some of these companies out of business. We need to work on the bylaws first, then the season(s) of sport next. Mike West asked if they are leaning toward the 2018-19 season for CIF competitions to begin. Rob Wigod reiterated that 2017-18 is bylaws only and that competitions will be down the road. There will be no cheer championships for 2017-18. Monica Colunga stated that the culture of schools and districts is not doing this kind of competition, so if it is a sport, does a school have to field it. Jim Perry asked if at the Advisory Committee meeting coming up, will Traditional Sideline Cheer be represented and the answer was no. Sandy Gahring added that at her school, all cheer is going to be treated the same. Dick Billingsley asked if Competitive Sport Cheer would be with different levels of competition. Monica Colunga stated that first we need to identify the bylaws and that nothing else can be answered until that occurs. The CIF State is taking its time and making sure things are in place properly and that we are being responsive to what the legislator who wrote the legislation intended this to be. Carter Paysinger said that we have to take it slowly. Sandy Gahring stated that the legislation that went through was due to pressure from parents and students. This is coming from legislation rather than growing from the CIF through schools and leagues. This is different and coming in a different way, so we are trying to be proactive as an organization and stay ahead of it. Jim Perry said that there is nothing in the bylaws that states you are required to field Cheer, just as with any other sport.

4. Proposed Revision Bylaws 1606; 2401; 2901; 2902 - Competitive Equity Placement - Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal. This was implemented state-wide with Football and is what we are already doing in the Southern Section in placing teams from the Southern Section into CIF Regional Championships. Terry Barnum talked about the dilemma of the Central Section being geographically too large with so few schools and asked if this proposal is a way to fix that and allow for schools to change sections for CIF Regionals. Rob Wigod answered yes, they could send some Southern Section schools to a Northern Regional, depending on their locations. Mike Middlebrook stated that the CIF State Seeding Committee did a good job in Girls' Volleyball and placed our teams appropriately last Fall.

5. Proposed Bylaws Revisions 503.B.1 - Uniform Administrative Penalty - Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal and referred the Executive Committee to the updated language distributed today. This proposal would cover sanctions on schools when it is an administrative oversight and paperwork is not turned in, when a student would have been eligible. These oversights are due to adult errors, and identify penalties that all sections would follow in issuing the same penalties. Rob Wigod said that there should be a comfort level with this proposal since this is what the Southern Section has been doing for years through Bylaw 500.21. The change is adding a second offense penalty to the Southern Section bylaw. Chris Calderwood asked if that was the case, why would we be opposed to this. Rob Wigod pointed out that the language was revised this past Wednesday and we now agree with it. Loren Kleinrock asked if administrators make errors, the students play, and then they find out later in a season, then they only lose the one game. Carter Paysinger stated that if the error was caused by the administration, not by the parent or student, that a one game forfeit is enough. Terry Barnum asked how many bylaws there are with penalties in place because of adult errors. Rob Wigod stated that the ineligible player bylaws are under the umbrella of adult errors.

6. Proposed Revision Bylaws 206; 207; 510; 1100 - Athletically Motivated Transfers - Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal stating that this proposal would remove the athletically motivated transfer language, related to dissatisfaction with the former school, from CIF Bylaw 510. There was no discussion.

7. Proposed Bylaws 1206 - Standardized Number of Contests - Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal and asked that members review the new language in front of them as the language changed from the original proposal in their packets. This proposal is trying to align the number of regular season contests across the State. For example, Basketball currently has 20 allowable contests in the Southern Section. The shift is now to 28 with each tournament game counting as one. Rainer Wulf stated that Basketball currently has 20 allowable games with three allowable tournaments, each counting as two games whether you play two or five. There could be more games played in the current model as opposed to the 28 in the proposed model. Chris Calderwood asked how do we respond to this if it passes at the Federated Council. Rob Wigod remarked that the difference would be one non-league game. This proposal provides for two scrimmages instead of one, but they still have to be completed before the first contest of the season. Loren Kleinrock asked if the league culminating tournament, counted toward the 28. Rob Wigod stated that the league culminating tournament does not count in the 28 allowable contests. Other sections use these culminating tournaments for playoff entries, but Southern Section does not. Rainer Wulf stated that from a coaching perspective, the last thing you want to do is play more games at the end of the regular season. It starts to wear on the students playing more games. Mike West stated that counting tournament games can be a challenge if you are counting on five and only playing two. Rob Wigod said if you schedule a tournament counting five games but only play three, then two games have opened up in your

schedule and you will not be over the allowable at the end of the season. Chris Calderwood agreed completely, but it is usually known that most tournaments have a guaranteed minimum.

This new system may be confusing and communication to the schools needs to happen to make sure there is an understanding they need to schedule only 28, not 29, including all tournament games. Rainer Wulf reminded the Executive Committee that this is for implementation for 2018-19 school year and gives us a lot of time to make schools aware of the change. Nancy Kelly stated why isn't the CIF State adopting our system since it works. Rob Wigod reiterated that the changes are so minor, as it only affects one non-league game and is adding another scrimmage. We have trouble with schools over scheduling now and it will be easier to just count every game played.

8. Proposed Bylaws 900 - All-Star Contests - Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal and asked the Committee to refer to the new language in the packet received today. This proposal would allow for all-star competition after the season of sport for all levels, not just Seniors who have completed their eligibility. Jim Monaco stated that underclassman can be in all-star contests. Glenn Martinez stated Football coaches will not be happy about this as they are already concerned about losing players do to injury in these competitions in the Spring. Loren Kleinrock asked about the use of school equipment. Glenn Martinez stated that current bylaws already forbid the use of school equipment. Terry Barnum asked about college bound students sitting out because they already have offers and do not want to get hurt. Carter Paysinger was concerned about this with any sport and the effect this has on students transferring schools. Do we want to regulate that as well? There is no reason for underclassman to play all-star games. Rainer Wulf stated that all-star games are designated as club games now and they would organize at schools instead clubs. Dave Reid said this came from the Section Commissioners. Terry Barnum showed concern for schools and kids and can we put a limit on what the families can do when we depend on these families for our programs. Loren Kleinrock said we need to be supportive of protecting our students. Jim Perry stated he is baffled by this proposal. If a Football student goes all the through the CIF State Championships and then plays in an all-star game, that is 17 games. What are we doing and why? This is opposite of what we are doing and we are allowing the parents to dictate what they want and we are not looking out for the well-being of the student-athlete. This flies in the face of the all-round, multi-sport, student-athlete. Terry Barnum stated that we are creating the superstar high school athletes, with their exposure on the web and TV. Fifteen years ago, they would have only been known in their area. Monica Colunga added that we need to take a step back and look at what our responsibility is for the safety of our students and stay on that path where the parent makes the choice and it doesn't come to litigation. Rob Wigod said that we do have a role we play, but what we are hearing is that the more we try to control outside the high school season of sport, the more we are exposed to litigation.

B. SOUTHERN SECTION NON-ACTION ITEMS -

1. Proposed CIF Southern Section Budget 2017-18 - Mitch Carty distributed the proposed budget and highlighted various items. The handout of the budget is contained at the end of these minutes. The budget presented is a balanced budget with no fees or ticket price increases included. One highlighted change is to move to electronic programs as printed programs are losing \$25,000 annually. Program sellers may hand out postcards with a QR code or website to access programs online. Chris Calderwood loves the program idea and it would allow an opportunity for programs for sports we do not do professional, printed programs for (i.e. tennis, golf, etc.) Loren Kleinrock asked if the fan would pay for that access, and if so, how do you protect it from being passed around. Mitch Carty stated that the advertisers have signed contracts for the exposure. Loren Kleinrock asked can we get more advertisers? Thom Simmons said programs would become more valuable because they would get more eyes on them and they would be available in perpetuity. This is what the CIF State is doing right now as well as the NCAA with very few printed programs in limited sports. Nancy Kelly stated that Track and Field would still need a printed program. Rob Wigod said yes, Track, Cross Country, Wrestling, and Swimming would still be done in hard copy. Terry Barnum showed concern with Football attendance numbers dropping. Mitch Carty said that we have been out at games and taken pictures of the sidelines, then Financial Reports come in and do not reflect what the pictures look like. Two school were contacted about this situation. This is not a new problem and most schools do a good job, but there is something going on whether it is an increased guest list, season ticket holders getting in free, cash taked and no ticket given, etc. Would like to do some on-site auditing to get out and watch some of the gate procedures at selected games. This year in the Football Championships, there were some new teams, some longer travel, and 40,000 fewer tickets sold. Paula Hart Rodas stated that when her school travelled to Paraclete, only 35 people went and they usually travel well. Loren Kleinrock asked with all the television/web games, are they just staying home? Rob Wigod answered sure, but the television/web games are exposure for advertisers, so it is a trade-off. Rob Wigod praised Mitch Carty's exemplary work on the budget. We will have a better idea a year from now on future numbers and there is still the rest of this year to come.

Thom Simmons said to look at then television income from four years ago and it appears we are offsetting some of the loss at the gates. Rainer Wulf added that with the divisions being done every year, nothing is a straight comparison.

1. CIF Southern Section Executive Committee Nominations - Carter Paysinger reviewed the areas for nomination. Paula Hart Rodas, Paul Lopez, and Denise Halstead are up for election in their areas. Only the leagues in their specific areas will vote at the April Council meeting.

2. Proposed Bylaw 3013 – Length of Quarters - Carter Paysinger reviewed the proposal regarding the length of quarters for Frosh/Soph Water Polo being increased from five minute quarters to six minute quarters and this proposal coincides with the Official's Fees Schedule.

5. NEW BUSINESS

A. Financial Report - Mitch Carty presented a PowerPoint presentation regarding the current budget year-to-date. Copies of the slides are contained at the end of these minutes.

B. CIF Southern Section 2018-19 Sports Calendar - Rob Wigod reviewed the proposed 2018-19 sports calendar. He referred to the middle of a memo in the Executive Committee packet that refers to the sports that have already changed due to decisions made by the CIF State Office. What is left are selected Fall and Spring sports and do not go to CIF State Regionals or CIF State Championships. Unsure of when the SOP dates may change but this will happen as well. Rob Wigod asked the Executive Committee for support to move this proposal forward to the Southern Section Council for first reading in January. The last page is a survey of schools' start and end dates and we are trying to match them up with the end of our sports year. Almost 90% of schools are out by first week of June. Before September 1, 80% of school are already in session. Carter Paysinger asked to take a look at Baseball and Softball where some schools are playing after Graduation and are playing schools that are still in Finals and perhaps not getting the practice time that those who have already graduated are able to. Glenn Martinez stated that Baseball starting early isn't going to be an issue except for those that have Basketball/Soccer athletes competing in playoffs. Mike Middlebrook stated that the Softball Advisory Committee is in support of the proposal. Carter Paysinger asked if anyone was opposed to moving this forward to the Southern Section Council. Mark Edgemon asked about the Winter/Spring seasons overlap. Rob Wigod said that there is a ten-day gap between the end of the Winter regular season and the start of Spring sports. Carter Paysinger asked for anyone opposed to moving this forward and not hearing any, it will be moved forward to the Southern Section Council for first reading on January 25, 2017.

C. Athletic Training Committee - Carter Paysinger presented a concern about school districts asking how to implement and fund athletic trainers on high school campuses and he would like to set up a committee for these types of questions and to get information out to our member schools over the next year or so. School districts need to see how important it is to make this a line item in their budgets and see what they will save in the long run. Mike West has already agreed to be a part of this committee with Monica Colunga and Carter Paysinger. Nancy Kelly is surprised at the reluctance of school districts to do this and being without an athletic trainer is astounding. Her school just added a second trainer and students are getting treated immediately. Nancy offered to prepare a letter to all Superintendents, to send this message out directly to them so they understand what is happening and why we feel so strongly about this. Mike West said that this hasn't been brought to light just now, it has been made available and the task is getting the information into the right hands, showing what can happen, how to do it and what the benefits are. Paula Hart Rodas stated that this was an LCAP meeting line item maintaining the academic success of student athletes and our next push would be that every school should have an athletic trainer. Nancy Kelly, along with John Norman and Paul Lopez, volunteered to serve on the committee.

D. CIF Southern Section Meeting Schedule 2017-18 - Rob Wigod reviewed the 2017-18 meeting calendar, that was included in the Executive Committee packet.

6. OLD BUSINESS

A. 2018-2022 Area Placement Recommendations - Rob Wigod reviewed the Area Placement recommendations for the 2018-2022 Releaguement Cycle. There was a motion and second to approve the recommendations as presented. There was no discussion. The motion carried 21-0-0.

A. President's Report- Carter Paysinger - Last night at dinner there was talk about our feelings for this organization. A key element to this organization is when we have our discussions, there is not a feeling that there is an agenda from any one person. We talk and debate the issues and yet we try to come up with a solution for the entire organization. That comes from Rob Wigod, the staff, and you and it just keeps getting better. This is a great organization run by a great group of people. One other item of interest. The director of the NCAA was talking about how people beat up on the NCAA however, the NCAA does not make the rules, the schools do. That is us. We do not make the rules, our member schools do, and we carry out what they desire. The CIF Southern Section is not just the office, but it is the entire membership. Any opportunity we

have we should remind the membership that they are the ones that can make changes, not the office.

B. Treasurer's Report - Jeff Jordan was absent so no Treasurer's Report was given.
