# COMMISSIONER'S CORNER

## AREA PLACEMENT/ RELEAGUING

One of the biggest issues and concerns that our member schools have involves Releaguings. Every four years, the task of configuring our leagues takes place. It is a subject that our member schools are extremely passionate about and take very seriously. The process involves having each of the nine designated areas of our section formulate a plan that places every school in that area into a league within that area for the next four years. However, before the formal Releaguings effort can begin, another important task must be accomplished that has a major effect on the ability of our areas to form viable leagues. That situation is called Area Placement.

Area Placement often gets ignored because of the much larger focus our schools put on Releaguings, but the decisions made regarding Area Placement can have a tremendous impact on how an area can arrive at a league configuration that works best for that area. We are currently involved in the Area Placement process for the 2014-2018 Releaguings Cycle. What that means is we are following the current CIF Southern Section Blue Book rules toward establishing the areas for our member schools so they may begin to develop their area's Releaguings Plan. To gain a better understanding of these Blue Book Rules, I suggest you visit our website, [www.cifss.org](http://www.cifss.org), where the entire Blue Book is available for you to download.

This year, some new Blue Book Rules will be applied to Area Placement for the first time. Specifically, the CIF Southern Section Office now has the responsibility of developing the Area Placement plan for our section. Here is the process we are following...

1) We surveyed the principals of our member schools to ask if they wished to remain in their current area or wished to be placed into a different area. The surveys were mailed out on September 14, 2012 and were due back in our office by October 12, 2012. A key component of this survey is a requirement that schools are only allowed to address their own placement into an area, they cannot address issues involving other schools in their area.

2) The results of our survey indicated that approximately 95% of our schools requested to remain in the area they are currently in.

# CIF-SS COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES October 6, 2015

## 1. OPENING BUSINESS

A. Call to order at 9:05 a.m. by Reggie Thompkins, President of the Council - Commissioner Wigod introduced the Council to a new electronic voting system to be utilized at Southern Section Council Meetings. Each voting member was issued a small device that allowed them to cast their vote in a timely manner (less than one minute). The results were displayed on a large screen so that each member could see the results. This method satisfies all legal requirements in that voting is now officially recorded. The results of today's voting items are attached at the back of these minutes.

1. Minutes of the April 29, 2015 Council Meeting - There was a motion and a second to approve the minutes from the previous Council meeting. The motion carried unanimously, 83-0-0.

## 2. PUBLIC HEARING SESSION

A. No speakers from the public were present.

## 3. ACTION ITEMS

A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposal Recommendation Change to Bylaws 1606, 2401, 2902, 2903 - There was a motion and

a second to approve STATE520. This proposal allows for a two-year pilot for the 4 sections in the southern part of the state: Central, Los Angeles, San Diego and Southern to forward entries into State Championships by utilizing competitive equity (as opposed to enrollment-based State Championships). There was no discussion. The motion carried 76-4-4.

## B. SOUTHERN SECTION ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposal Recommendation Change to Bylaw 1607 - There was a motion and second to approve SS519. This proposal will allow basketball coaches, by mutual agreement, to select a running clock in games if a team is ahead by 40 points, or more, at any time in the contest. This does not have to be determined prior to the game's start and will be for both boys' and girls' basketball. Administration would not be involved in the mutual decision making process by the coaches. This motion carried 83-1-0.

2. Proposal Recommendation Change to Bylaw 2502 - There was a motion and second to approve SS521. This changes "required" to "recommended" in the requirement for base coaches to wear a helmet in the sport of softball only. The mandate began in the 2015 season for baseball and softball. If this passes, this will move on to the state level as the requirement is currently a CIF State bylaw. The motion failed 38-44-2. Softball coaches will continue to be required to wear helmets during base coaching.

1. Process and development of Bylaws for AB949- This Bylaw deals with the addition of cheerleading as a CIF sport. No questions and no discussion on this item.

2. Proposed Recommendations for Change to Bylaws 204, 207, 213 - No questions and no discussion on this item.

### B. SOUTHERN SECTION NON-ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposal Recommendation Change to Bylaw 3219 - This proposal will change the way Playoff Groupings are done in most team sports. Currently, schools are placed in divisions based on the competitive equity of their league. This model would take each individual school's ability into account allowing schools within a league to move into different divisions for playoffs. Schools will still qualify for playoffs out of league play, however, in this model; they are not bound to the same division thereafter. This will require every game score be entered into CIFSS Home as the success of this power rankings model depends on complete and accurate information (all game scores shared in the system). In the past, the playoff grouping system used playoff success by a league to determine placement. This system will use a school's entire schedule to determine placement. The San Diego and Central Sections have something comparable to this system currently. Schools will receive information in December for the current Playoff Groupings process as we must continue that process in the event this proposal is not supported.

2. Proposal Recommendation Change to Sports Calendar - This proposal would change the fall and spring sports calendar as schools are starting and ending earlier. This would move the sports of girls volleyball, cross country, girls tennis and boys water polo one week earlier in the fall. In the spring, the baseball/softball seasons would begin two weeks earlier and boys tennis and boys volleyball would be one week earlier. Currently many schools are out of school in the spring when the playoffs conclude. There was no discussion at this time.

### 5. REPORT SESSION

A. President's Report - Reggie Thompkins - The CIF State office hosted the 2015 NFHS Section 7/8 Meeting in September. This is an opportunity for the State Associations to come together and discuss/share the issues in their state. Discussions centered around the evaluation processes, the setting of salaries, and safety issues. The CIF-SS is also proud of the refund given to our member schools for 2014-2015 school year dues.

B. Treasurer's Report - Jeff Jordan - The 2014-2015 audit was healthy and clean with approval from the Audit Committee and Executive Committee. Even after refunding the schools' dues, there was a \$42,000 profit from the 2014-2015 school year. Revenue currently is less than expenses because section playoffs have not started. We are also waiting for dues payments from member schools. Please encourage schools within leagues to take care of sports fees. Approximately 47 schools have dues outstanding.

C. Commissioner's Report - Rob Wigod - Jim Perry (reporting on behalf of the Public Private Committee): This group is working to improve the perception of public vs. private schools. The group attempts to dispel the myths of inequities between schools. They are in support of the competitive equity model for playoff groupings. The next step in this is looking at CIF Bylaw 510

and how social media/advertising has changed the face of how schools are marketing themselves. There are many ways schools are marketing themselves (Open Houses, Back to School Nights, 8th Grade Info Fairs, Student Shadowing, etc.). It is up schools to do things correctly. As competitive equity moves forward, there needs to be some patience in allowing these systems to work. 90% of students in the CIF-SS attend Public Schools with 10% attending Private Schools; competitive equity is the issue.

Rob Wigod: The Commissioner is proud of the \$1.9 million dollars that was returned to schools this past year. The Athletic Administrators Summit (October 19th, 8:00am) is coming up. Friday, October 10th is the deadline to sign up for this event. Currently we have over 350 individuals signed up. We are always trying to improve and the Athletic Administrator Summit event is one of those ways.

# MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

## August 13, 2015

### 1. OPENING BUSINESS

A. Call to order by Reggie Thompkins, President of the Council 1:00

Meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m.

B. Pledge of Allegiance

C. Roll Call

All members were present except Chris Calderwood, Mike West, and John Costello.

D. Introduction of Guests - Rob Wigod introduced the CIF-SS Administrative Assistants to the Executive Committee. Thom Simmons introduced members of the media that were present- Eric Sondheimer, Los Angeles Times; Aram Tolegian, Los Angeles News Group. - Reggie Thompkins introduced the new members of the Executive Committee: Dick Billingsley, Mark Edgemon, Robert Kostopoulos, Dana Wilkerson, Paula Hart Rodas, and Mike West (absent).

E. Adopt Agenda - Adopted Amended Agenda - Unanimous Carter Paysinger made a motion to move 5A-5C to the beginning of the agenda in order to approve the new members and allow their attendance at the meeting. The motion was moved, seconded, and unanimously approved to adjust the agenda and vote to appoint the following Executive Committee positions: Coast Area Representative - Dr. Paula Hart Rodas - It was moved and seconded to approve her appointment. The motion carried unanimously. Desert Area Representative - Robert Kostopoulos - It was moved and seconded to approve his appointment. The motion carried unanimously. At-Large Representative - Dana Wilkerson - It was moved and seconded to approve her appointment. The motion carried unanimously. Reggie Thompkins congratulated the new members and welcomed them to the Executive Committee.

F. Approval of Minutes

A motion and second were made to approve the minutes of the May 13, 2015 Executive Committee Meeting. Before a vote was taken, Reggie Thompkins, for the benefit of the new members, asked everyone to introduce themselves and gave a special welcome for Terry Barnum returning to us. Then a vote was taken and the minutes were approved.

### 2. PUBLIC HEARING SESSION

A. Recognition of anyone wishing to address the Executive Committee. Speakers must limit their remarks to three minutes. There was no one present to address the Executive Committee.

### 3. ACTION ITEMS

A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL ACTION ITEMS

There are no action items at this time.

B. SOUTHERN SECTION ACTION ITEMS

There are no action items at this time.

### 4. NON-ACTION ITEMS

A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL NON-ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposal Recommendation Change to Bylaws 1606, 2401, 2902, 2903 - Carter Paysinger reviewed bylaw change. There was no discussion.

B. SOUTHERN SECTION NON-ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposal Recommendation Change to Bylaw 1607 - Reggie Thompkins reviewed the recommended bylaw change. Loren Kleinrock questioned why the determining factor was 40 points. Rob Wigod explained that current NFHS Rule in a lead of 40 points or more and the desire is to be able to run the clock earlier if the 40 point spread was achieved earlier in the game.

2. Proposal Recommendation Change to Bylaw 2502 - Reggie Thompkins reviewed the recommended bylaw change. Brandi Stuart reviewed earlier discussions regarding the desires of the softball community. In speaking with others through the NFHS, it was discovered that California is the only state having these discussions. The Softball Advisory Committee is simply asking for consideration that was not given to softball being a separate sport from baseball. Reggie Thompkins reminded the Executive Committee that the softball community feels it was lumped together in this rule with baseball without consideration for the differences between the sports. Jim Monico does not understand why it makes a difference and Jim Perry agreed. Monica Colunga chimed in as well as Dick Billingsley on the differences between the two sports. Loren Kleinrock brought up not only are hit balls a concern, but thrown balls as well. Reggie Thompkins clarified that the point is the softball community wanted the conversation that should have taken place before the rule went into effect.

5. NEW BUSINESS (These items were moved to the beginning of the agenda)

A. Appointment of Coast Area Representative to the Executive Committee

B. Appointment of Desert Area Representative to the Executive Committee

### 5. NEW BUSINESS (Cont.)

A. Distribution of 2014-15 budget surplus to Southern Section member schools - Approved - Unanimously. Reggie Thompkins deferred to Rob Wigod regarding the budget surplus and the ability to return dues to the schools. Mitch Carty confirmed that the year ended as projected with a \$516,000 surplus and that \$475,250 would be rebated back to the schools, leaving a \$41,000 surplus for the 2014-15 school year. There was a motion to approve rebating the 2014-15 annual dues back to the schools. It was moved and seconded. Dana Wilkerson asked how much each school would receive? Mitch Carty answered with what each school paid last year in dues. Checks would be mailed to the principals and labeled to be opened by addressee only. Terry Barnum worried about the how this might make the Southern Section appear to the other Sections. Rob Wigod stated that the Southern Section is perceived as leaders in the State and applauded our ability to do this. \$1.8 million in total revenues was returned to schools from our \$4.8 million budget from the 2014-15 school year. Many things contributing to that figure include our TV/radio rights fees, our corporate sponsorships, championship event splits, and the dues refund. Reggie Thompkins reminded that the State CIF has done something similar. Dave Reid said CIF Sac-Joquin Section has done this also. Mitch Carty reported that over 600,000 tickets a year are sold through all events and the \$1 ticket price increase last year brought increased revenues into the Section's budget. The motion was approved unanimously. Rob Wigod thanked the Executive Committee for approving this historic gesture. A Message from the Commissioner will be mailed to each member school's principal, along with their checks tomorrow. Reggie Thompkins said this was the most exciting moment since he has been with this board starting in 2006.

B. Reconsideration of Yeshiva Tech High School Membership for 2015-16 Approved Revisit - 21-0-1 Rob Wigod went over the steps that have brought this request forward. Their first year there was no response to the request regarding their athletic program from the year so they were placed on probationary for the 2014-15 school year. At the end of the second year, there was still no response to the request for information so the Executive Committee voted to rescind Yeshiva High Tech's membership for the 2015-16 school year. Then, the office received the information before you, asking for reconsideration. There was a motion and a second to reconsider to their membership for the 2015-16 school year based on the information submitted. Loren Kleinrock had done the original new member visit. Seeing the letter requesting membership into the International League, Loren Kleinrock asked what the league's feeling is regarding Yeshiva Tech or will they be a freelance member. Nancy Kelly asked to give consideration to the fact that the principal just came on board and inherited this situation. Jim Monico questioned if we have received all the information we need in order to consider even probationary membership. Monica Colunga stated that we are penalizing kids for the mistakes of adults and a new principal. Rob Wigod reiterated the minimum requirements for probationary membership. Terry Barnum wonders what harm is being done by reinstating them as probationary members. Jim Monico and Carter Paysinger asked for more information to see if they can meet the minimum terms of membership. Loren Kleinrock is willing to revisit the school. Jim Monico felt follow-up is needed either way the vote goes. Monica Colunga requested an amendment to the motion. Monica Colunga's amended motion was to reconsider probationary membership for Yeshiva Tech pending a revisit to the school site to see if they can meet the minimum standard for probationary membership. There was a second. The amended motion was approved and superseded the original motion. Yeshiva High Tech's membership will be reinstated if they meet the minimum requirements for probationary membership.

C. 2016-17 Seasons of Sport Calendars for Fall and Spring Sports - Rob Wigod - Rob Wigod distributed documentation showing the proposed 2016-17 sports calendar. He explained how this proposed calendar was created and the survey being conducted with the membership for start and end dates for the next two school years. Statewide, 91% of schools are starting before September 1st. 70% of schools statewide end school before June 1st. It is proposed to move fall and spring sports start dates up a week earlier for selected sports. This gives the opportunity to finish fall playoffs before Thanksgiving and the spring playoffs before Memorial Day weekend. Would like to have a proposal for first read in October so a vote can be taken in January for implementation for the 2016-17 school year. April is too late as many fall schedules are already set by then. The State CIF is already in talks regarding moving the football regionals forward. The next step is for the sport administrators to present this proposal to their advisory

committees. Terry Orabona asked how does this effect students who are multi-sport athletes and their turn around from winter to spring. Rob Wigod reminded the Executive Committee that all the winter sports, except for water polo, have State Playoffs which establishes the winter calendar. Rainer reminded that the winter was moved up a week with the removal of the scrimmage date.

D. Return to Play Protocols/Sudden Cardiac Arrest - Glenn Martinez - Glenn Martinez gave an overview of the return to play protocols for concussions and the sudden cardiac arrest procedures and where to find the information on our website. Sandy Gahring had a league meeting yesterday and the question came up as to how do we know the doctors making these decisions have been trained. Glenn explained that school personnel are to be assigned to oversee the return to play protocols and that each level has been met. Break - 2:35-2:48: Moved on to old business as there were some technical difficulties in the meeting room.

### 6. OLD BUSINESS

A. Playoff Groupings - Competitive Equity - Rob Wigod - Rob Wigod reviewed a memo from 2010 when Rob was an Assistant Commissioner regarding standardizing playoff groupings and commented how the staff was revisiting the issue. He distributed the recommended new language for the Blue Book and gave an explanation regarding the language. Loren Kleinrock asked for clarification of the football entries. Terry Barnum asked could a league champion in football not make the playoffs. Is there a reason we are not guaranteeing league champions? Rob Wigod explained in more detail how the divisions were determined under the new format. Glenn Martinez went into detail regarding the possibilities for football. Rainer Wulf talked about the changes to the basketball model and that over the past seven years, the formula has been changed six times. The key to this working is for everyone to do their part and to be patient as we work through the process. Rob Wigod wanted to get this in your hands for potential first read for Council in October and for vote in January, 2016 for implementation in the fall of 2016 using the previous two years of data. This would also be good for spring sports as we will be able to use two years of data which we have not been able to do in the past. Terry Barnum would like to see any Division 1 Championship school receive a banner in addition to the plaque. Rob Wigod then explained that page two addresses the sports not covered under the new playoff grouping format and how those sports determine their groupings. Does anyone object to staff moving forward to October Council meeting for first read? There were no objections.

### 7. CLOSED SESSION

A. Commissioner's Goals

The Committee went into closed session from 3:30 p.m. to 3:43 p.m. The Executive Committee voted unanimously to accept the Commissioner's goals for the 2015-16 school year. LAST NEW BUSINESS ITEM

H. Financial Report - Mitch Carty - Mitch distributed the 2014-15 financial report and gave an explanation of each page of the report.

### 8. REPORT SESSION

A. President's Report - Reggie Thompkins - Happy 60th Birthday to Glenn! Reggie had a great summer with family vacations and family athletics. He feels that high school athletic events are still about the purest place to be. He is excited about the upcoming high school season and implored the Committee to get out there and see these athletes perform.

B. NFHS Summer Meeting Report - Carter Paysinger, Debi Weiss  
Carter Paysinger has a fantastic time and was impressed with the event. Networking with other parts of the country is very interesting and confirms that Southern Section is the elite of not only the state, but the nation, being ahead of the curve in many areas of high school athletics.

Debi Weiss found the conference interesting from the activities director perspective. Other states have all the extra-curricular activities overseen by the athletic office. Debi attended one session regarding the leading a crowd and sideline cheerleading and another session on handling difficult conversations with parents, coaches, etc. All PowerPoint presentations from the conference can be found on the NFHS website.

Reggie Thompkins commented that the national focus is on safety.

C. Treasurer's Report - Jeff Jordan - Jeff Jordan reported that the financial audit will be in two weeks. Reporting on sports fees, there are 584 member schools, 346 have created invoices, and 121 have paid their dues. That is a little behind this time of year last year. In 2015-16, there will be some capital improvements which includes enclosing the storage cages in back of the building.

# MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

## October 1, 2015

### 1. OPENING BUSINESS

- Call to order by Reggie Thompkins, President of the Council Meeting was called to order at 1:17 p.m.
- Pledge of Allegiance
- Roll Call
- All members were present.
- Introduction of Guests

Rob Wigod introduced the CIF-SS Administrative Assistants observing the meeting from the back of the room. Rob formally thanked the staff for all they do and for their assistance with the new voting system.

E. Adopt Agenda - Adopted - 23-0 - CIF-SS Administrative Assistant Jackie Gibson walked the committee through the new electronic voting system and ran several tests before actual voting could begin. There was a motion and a second to adopt the agenda. The motion was approved and the agenda was adopted without revision.

F. Approval of Minutes - Approved - 22-0-1 - A motion and second were made to approve the minutes of the August 13, 2015 Executive Committee meeting. The minutes were approved.

### 2. PUBLIC HEARING SESSION

A. Recognition of anyone wishing to address the Executive Committee. Speakers must limit their remarks to three minutes. There was no one present to address the Executive Committee.

### 3. ACTION ITEMS

#### A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposal Recommendation Change to Bylaws 1606, 2401, 2902, 2903 - Carter Paysinger reviewed the proposal. There was a motion and a second to approve this proposal. There was no discussion and the Executive Committee approved the motion unanimously.

#### B. SOUTHERN SECTION ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposal Recommendation Change to Bylaw 1607 - Reggie Thompkins reviewed the proposal. There was a motion and a second to approve this proposal. There was no discussion and the Executive Committee approved the motion unanimously.

2. Proposal Recommendation Change to Bylaw 2502 - Reggie Thompkins reviewed the proposal. There was a motion and a second to approve this proposal. Nancy Kelly asked for clarification of the wording, is the difference recommended not required. Mike West asked for clarification, is this just for softball, not baseball. Loren Kleinrock asked if a school chooses to use students as base coaches, why are they not required to wear a helmet and it was stated that they are required, this proposal only involves adult base coaches. The Executive Committee did not approve the motion.

#### 4. NON-ACTION ITEMS

##### A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL NON-ACTION ITEMS

1. Process and development of Bylaws for AB949 - Carter Paysinger reviewed the proposal which is laying out the timeline for instituting cheerleading as an approved CIF sport. Loren Kleinrock asked if the proposal requires the sport of cheerleading to be on all campuses as the other approved sports are not required. Reggie Thompkins commented that this movement is showing more respect for cheerleading but the question remains, what is competitive cheerleading? Rob Wigod stated that this new Bylaw is coming from State Legislators and the CIF has been enlisted so that CIF can write the rules, rather than legislators. As of this meeting, the Governor of California has not signed this bill into law. There are many decisions that need to be made that may not have been considered when this bill was brought before the legislators. Mike West brought forth information from the athletic trainers association and Terry Orabona asked if USA Cheerleading was in favor of this and apparently they are not. Terry Orabona also voiced the concern that leagues would put too much focus on the competition and lose focus on sideline cheerleading. Mike West recommended this bylaw reflect only stunt competition with a spring season of sport. Debi Weiss felt that schools may make a choice between competition and non-competition and not field a competition team. Jim Perry asked about our regulations as it relates to some basic aspects of this situation: number of contests, transportation, uniforms, athletic motivation. Dave Reid commented on the number of competitions already taking place and how that would influence participation at the high school level. Sandy Gahrning brought up that the rules will be in the Blue Book and once instituted, cannot be argued. Dick Billingsley stated that the institution of cheerleading would help in equalizing the numbers of boys and girls for schools struggling with Title IX issues. Rob Wigod reminded the Executive Committee that this proposal is informational in relation to the timeline for next steps.

2. Proposed Recommendations for Change to Bylaws 204, 207, 213 - Carter Paysinger reviewed the proposal regarding the language relating to homeless students. Rob Wigod stated this proposal came from legal counsel as it was felt we needed this additional language in our bylaws. Terry Barnum asked what a local school agency is and was told it is a public school district and he further asked what a local school agency would be for a private school with the response being it is those who have oversight of private schools: Archdiocese or Board of Trustees. Loren Kleinrock asked if there were any age limits. These cases would be ruled on in a case by case manner with a defined hardship related to the Age Requirement Bylaw. Monica Colunga stated this is only for the public schools and that the wording may need to be changed for private and charter schools.

##### B. SOUTHERN SECTION NON-ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposal Recommendation Change to Bylaw 3219 - Reggie Thompkins reviewed the proposal. Rob Wigod presented a PowerPoint presentation regarding the proposal for Playoff Groupings by Competitive Equity. The PowerPoint will be posted on the CIF-SS website after the October 6, 2015 Southern Section Council Meeting. Mike West asked for a way to receive a confirmation from CIFSSHOME when all game scores are entered into the system. There was a discussion regarding having all of the assigning of games done through CIFSSHOME in order to guarantee that all games are entered into the system. Since all games will need to have officials, if they are not entered into the system, they will not have officials assigned. This system is based on the requirement that all schools enter complete and accurate data. Jeff Jordan asked if the Assistant Commissioners will be investigating and following up with those schools that are missing games and Rob Wigod said yes. Missing one or two games might not have the impact as many games missing. Terry Barnum asked about how much involvement the advisory committees will have and it was stated it would still be the same. Mike West wondered why Dual Wrestling is not involved in this new structure. Rob Wigod stated that there is no way to get regular standard scoring and in turn, cannot get them ranked. Dick Billingsley asked if forfeit is a loss and was told yes. Rainer Wulf stated that this is an evolution and that the formulas will be changing from year to year as we work on making this process more accurate. In comparing it to the basketball model, the formulas have shifted four times over the past eight years. Terry Barnum voiced that transparency throughout this process will be a key part of it being accepted. Jim Perry stated that the Basketball Advisory Committee has been very transparent about their evolution involving Playoff Groupings. Glenn Martinez wanted to make sure schools do not focus on who is in their division and that schools still need to make the playoffs. Also, schools need to be accurate in their inputting of scores, i.e. non-CIF schools. Reggie Thompkins sees beauty in this, overall, and is in favor of trying it.

2. Proposal Recommendation Change to Sports Calendar - Reggie Thompkins reviewed the proposal regarding sport calendar changes. Rob Wigod reviewed the proposed sports calendar from the packet. This proposal is targeting sports that do not have State Championships to get in line with our school calendars. Administrators are working with their advisory committees.

### 5. NEW BUSINESS

A. Acceptance of 2014-15 Audit - Mitch Carty reviewed the audit. He thanked Shirley Frazier, Dave Reid, Rob Wigod, Reggie Thompkins, and Erin Crenshaw for their help and support. Mitch Carty presented a PowerPoint highlighting parts of the audit for the 2014-15 school year. Reggie Thompkins shared that the Audit Committee voted to accept the audit. There was a motion and a second to accept the audit. The motion was approved unanimously. Reggie Thompkins left the meeting at 2:50 p.m. and left Carter Paysinger in charge. Carter Paysinger gave a 10 minute break at 2:50. The Committee returned from break at 3:02 p.m.

B. Financial Report - Mitch Carty - Mitch Carty gave a Financial Report. There has been a 30% staff turnover in the last year. The office is utilizing three people to cover the front desk through the end of the calendar year. Third quarter was difficult in relation to investment revenue. There are still ongoing projects: the storage units behind the building and the use of some of that space as possible office space in future. Thom Simmons talked about getting ready for the document scanning and how that process will generate space as we dispose of paper in addition to making all items searchable. Mitch Carty appreciates everything the leadership has done and we are in a good place.

C. Marketing Report - John Costello - John Costello reported a 20% drop in revenue from the State Office. In spite of the drop, we are 9% up in sponsorship revenue and over \$900,000 in total sponsorship revenue for the first time in our history. Jack in the Box has returned and we have also signed a new agreement with Golds Gym. This is a renewal year with Ford and they seem happy. Working on promotions to make Ford more visible with things like pep rallies and test drive incentives. Working on licensing as CIF Southern Section is a registered trademark with the State of California and it needs to be protected. This means items are not to be made through non-licensed companies and we are now licensing with a variety of companies throughout the Section to allow some flexibility for consumers to purchase desired items. Licensing has generated \$14,000 in income so far. We have renewed all of our ball agreement sponsors in the last three weeks and have signed for \$505,000, a 31% increase from last year. We have been able to write these contracts to place a cap to what the companies can charge for their products to our schools and we are 20% lower than the rest of the nation. Debi Weiss asked about how to get involved in the rivalry games being sponsored by Ford.

### 6. REPORT SESSION

A. NFHS Section 7/8 Report - Jeff Jordan, Carter Paysinger, Reggie Thompkins - Jeff Jordan enjoyed the 3-4 days Newport Beach, networking with the other 12 states that were represented at the meeting. He walked out of there thinking we do things really well. Attendance and contracts with TV appear to be bringing down attendance in the other states, which is something we are not experiencing. Jim Perry enjoyed the conference and retold a story about a rare bird on one of the Hawaiian Islands that forced a change in playing their high school football games from Friday nights to Thursday afternoons because of the lights interfering with the migration pattern of the birds. Carter Paysinger said he came away with the feeling that we are so far out from

of the states around us and that we see issues before they do. Let's keep moving forward and stay out in front. Jim Monaco stated that the other states are amazed at how large our numbers are with issues like transfers, misconducts, sanctions, etc. Reggie Thompkins ran a workshop on how to evaluate the Commissioner including our process for hiring new assistants and negotiating salary. It was very well received.

B. President's Report - Reggie Thompkins - Reggie Thompkins had to leave early so there was no President's Report.

C. Treasurer's Report - Jeff Jordan - Jeff Jordan stated that Mitch Carty did a great job going over the budget and the audit. Our net income is a negative \$80,000 right now but that is typical for this time of year as sports fees are the only revenue coming in at this time. The office has received 503 sports fees payments of the 582 sports fees due as of this date. Jeff Jordan also commented on each department in the office and how well they do. It is pretty impressive and kudos to the office staff.

D. Commissioner's Report - Rob Wigod - Rob Wigod is proud of the office staff. He gave a thank you to all those that attended the Section 7/8 Conference. The whole staff was there with it in our own backyard. It went very well and Roger Blake, Executive Director of the CIF appreciated everything that was done. He thanked Sharon Hodge for the great work on the Champions for Character Dinner. It was the biggest and best one to date. He is excited with the discussions that are coming about regarding the things the office is bringing forward. The Executive Committee Meeting to be held on April 5, 2016 meeting is a set date and time but details will be announced at a later date. Please let us know what we can do to serve you and our Section better and thank you all for being here. We had perfect attendance.

#### E. Executive Committee Member Reports

President-Elect - Carter Paysinger - The Office was able to replace 30% of staff seamlessly and that is a tremendous feat. It was done without missing a beat.

Treasurer/Mt. SAC Area Representative - Jeff Jordan - The Champions for Character Dinner was really well done.

CSADAR Representative - Sandy Gahrning - CSADA meeting in San Diego will see a change in format.

FootHill Area Representative - Loren Kleinrock - Is amazed by work of this group. Our current bylaws do not specify what can be done after an athletic event is concluded. With the incident that occurred this past week, it seemed the officials should have been able to do something to keep it from happening again and that some penalty should have been able to be applied.

CSBA Representative - John Norman - Kudos for Monday night's event, it was really well done and well attended. We had a cheerleader issue last May and it was talked about at length. Will bring information as it is received.

At-Large Representative - Dana Wilkerson - Thanks to Sharon Hodge for the blue blazer. She was the Toastmaster at Long Beach State Basketball this evening.

## KIRK MORRISON SPEAKS AT 40TH ANNUAL FOOTBALL PRESS CONFERENCE AND LUNCHEON

Former National Football League linebacker with the Oakland Raiders, Kirk Morrison will be the keynote speaker at the 40th Annual CIF Southern Section-Ford Football Championship Press Conference and Luncheon. Morrison is currently an analyst teamed up with Dick Stockton calling one of the Sunday games on the NFL on Fox.

Morrison, 33, is no stranger to the CIF having played high school football at Bishop O'Dowd in Oakland. There he won varsity letters in football and track & field. In football, he led his team to two Heyward Area Athletic League (HAAL) Championships and two Northern Coast Section (NCS) 3A Championships. He was as a two-time All-HAAL honoree, and as a senior, was the HAAL Defensive Player of the Year.

Morrison attended college at San Diego State University and while at SDSU, he was two-time Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year. Morrison is among the most decorated Aztecs

of all time. He is one of only 13 two-time All-Americans, and one of only 11 first-team All-Americans in SDSU history. As a senior in 2004, Morrison was a team captain, awarded the John Simcox Memorial Trophy (Team MVP) and a Butkus Award semifinalist.

Morrison is currently San Diego State's career leader in unassisted tackles (241) and fumble recoveries (10), and ranks second in career total tackles (396), third in career assisted tackles (155) and fourth in forced fumbles (7).

In 2014 Morrison was inducted into the San Diego State University Athletics Hall of Fame. A third-round pick by the Oakland Raiders in 2005, Morrison played in all 16 games as a rookie, ending the season with 116 tackles and two pass deflections. He finished the 2006 season with a team leading 128 tackles, a sack, a defensive touchdown, and two interceptions. Morrison started the 2007 season with an interception in each of his first three games, joining

Thomas Howard who had an interception through each of his first 4 games. He led the Oakland Raiders with 120 tackles, and tacked on 10 passes defended and a quarterback sack to his totals. In 2008, Morrison ranked fifth in the NFL with 135 tackles. He also forced two fumbles and had one sack. He finished the 2009 season tied 6th in the NFL with 133 tackles. He forced three fumbles, recovering one, and had two sacks while playing most of the season with a dislocated elbow.

Morrison was traded to the Jacksonville Jaguars along with a fifth-round pick in the 2010 NFL Draft for the 108th pick in the same draft. Morrison's first game against his hometown and former team, the Oakland Raiders, was held in Jacksonville on December 12, 2010, the Jaguars won 38-31. On August 24, 2011, he signed with the Buffalo Bills. On December 3, 2012 he was released by the Bills. He was signed again by the Bills on December 20, 2012.

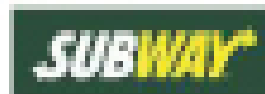
